What is a Comprehensive Plan?

A Comprehensive Plan is a long-range policy document designed to guide the future physical, economic, and social development of Carlton. Serving as the Village's blueprint for the next 20 to 30 years, it establishes a shared community vision and identifies the goals, strategies, and actions needed to achieve the vision. Developed through a collaborative planning process with input from residents, businesses, stakeholders, and local leaders, the Plan reflects the community's priorities and aspirations. The Plan will integrate housing, economic development, transportation, community facilities, natural and cultural resources, parks and recreation, and implementation into a unified strategy that guides future investments, policies, and partnerships.

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What We've Heard So Far

The community survey revealed strong appreciation for the qualities that make Carlton unique, including its rural character, waterfront access, open space, and close-knit community. Residents value the town's quiet and peaceful setting and the connections they have to family, friends, and the community.

The survey also identified gaps in everyday amenities, including limited places to eat and shop, local services, community events, and activities, as well as concerns about roads and infrastructure.

Looking to the future, residents generally support growth and new opportunities, but want development to be gradual, manageable, and consistent with Carlton's existing character. These priorities suggest that the Comprehensive Plan should focus on maintaining the qualities that make Carlton unique while supporting local businesses, improving services and infrastructure, protecting natural and agricultural resources, and guiding future growth in a thoughtful way.



Comprehensive Plan Myths

Myth: *A Comprehensive Plan will raise taxes or require costly new projects, or expensive changes.*

Fact: A Comprehensive Plan will help the Town plan for ahead by identifying priorities and strategies to avoid costly reactive decisions later and are prepared to pursue funding opportunities as they arise.

Myth: *The Comprehensive Plan changes current property rights or automatically alters local zoning laws.*

Fact: *The comprehensive plan is a policy framework, while a zoning ordinance is the legally binding law. The plan recommends how land should be used in the future, but distinct legislative action (rezoning) is required to legally enforce those changes.*

Myth: *Once adopted, it never changes.*

Fact: It's a living document that is updated as community needs and goals evolve.

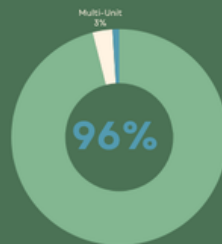

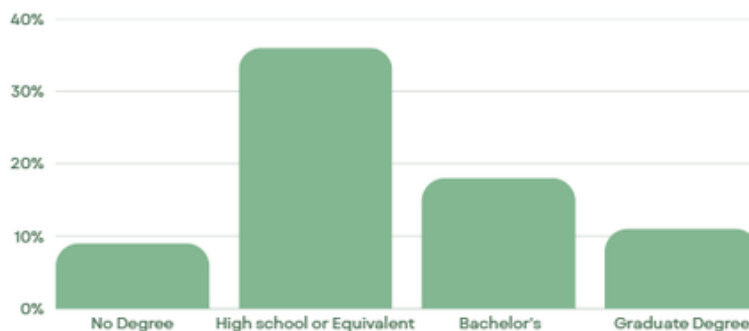
